Anxiety Control When using benzodiazepines in combination with Pain Control Morphine Sulfate 01 mg/kg (max of 4mg per dose) IV/IM/IO titrated to effect OR Fentanyl 1 mcg/kg (max 75mcg per dose) IV/IM/IO Use 2mcg/kg for (max 100mcg per dose) IN (Intranasal) For additional doses, contact OLMC:
